**BE IT RESOLVED, BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF JASPER,
ALABAMA, that:**

Section 1. The City of Jasper hereby adopts the Employee Travel Reimbursement Policies and Procedures, the purpose of which is to establish clear guidelines under which City employees will be reimbursed for authorized travel expenses incurred while conducting official City business.


Section 2. The adopted policies, attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated herein by reference, provide both guidance and procedures for incurring, documenting, and reporting travel expenses in a manner that ensures the appropriate and responsible use of public funds.


Section 3. City employees are expected to exercise sound judgment and fiscal responsibility in all travel-related expenditures. Public funds must be used efficiently and solely for the benefit of the City.



City of Jasper Travel Reimbursement Policy

1. Purpose

This policy establishes uniform guidelines for authorizing, incurring, and reimbursing travel expenses for employees conducting official City business. All travel must comply with Alabama travel laws and reflect responsible stewardship of public funds.

2. General Requirements

- Travel must support official City business.
- Employees must travel responsibly and exercise prudent judgment.
- All travel requires Department Head approval.
- Out-of-state travel requires approval by the Mayor.
- No employee may approve their own travel.
- Only employees in approved travel status may be reimbursed.

3. Required Documentation

- A Travel Authorization Form is required for all overnight travel.
- A Travel Reimbursement Form must be submitted within ten (10) business days after travel.
- Itemized receipts are required for all reimbursable expenses.
- Mileage reimbursement requires a Google Maps printout.
- Credit card statements are not substitutes for itemized receipts.

4. Types of Travel

4.1 Day Travel:

- Employee returns home or to their workstation the same day.
- Mileage reimbursed at the IRS rate.
- Meals reimbursed at actual cost with itemized receipts.



4.2 Overnight Travel:

- Authorized when same-day travel is impractical.
- Reimbursable items include lodging, meals, transportation, and registration fees.

5. Meals & Incidentals (Actual Cost)

- Meals reimbursed at actual cost up to \$85/day.
- Itemized receipts required.
- Tips up to 20% allowed.
- Alcohol is not reimbursable.
- In-town meals before/after travel are not reimbursable.

Meals Provided by the Event

When meals are included as part of a conference, workshop, meeting, or other official function, those meals are not eligible for reimbursement. This applies even if the employee chooses not to participate in or consume the provided meal. Only meals purchased at the employee's personal expense, and not provided by the event, may be submitted for reimbursement.

Meals Purchased for Employees

State law prohibits the use of public funds to purchase meals for employees except under very limited operational circumstances. Supervisors, Department Heads, or other staff may not purchase meals for employees, and such expenses will not be reimbursed by the City. Exceptions may be made only during an emergency event or during mandatory job-required training that occurs during established meal periods, and only with prior approval from the Mayor's Office.

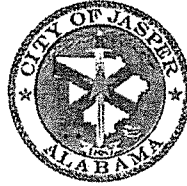
6. Transportation

Personal Vehicles:

- Reimbursed at the IRS mileage rate.
- Parking and tolls reimbursed.
- Fuel, repairs, and insurance not reimbursable.

City Vehicles:

- Fuel, parking, tolls reimbursed.



Air Travel:

- Coach/economy fare only.
- Change fees reimbursed only for business reasons.

Rental Cars:

- Compact class preferred.
- Collision/damage waiver not reimbursable domestically.

7. Lodging

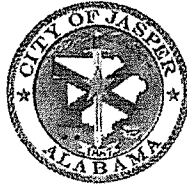
- Lodging reimbursed at actual cost with itemized receipts.
- Conference-rate lodging should be used when available.
- Non-refundable deposits reimbursed if cancellation required for business.

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of Jasper, Alabama, as follows:



ORDINANCE NO. 2025 - 31**AN ORDINANCE TO INCREASE EFFICIENCY OF MUNICIPAL OPERATIONS BY
ELIMINATION OF UNNECESSARY BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS WITHIN THE
CITY OF JASPER, ALABAMA**

WHEREAS, the City of Jasper, Alabama, has from time to time provided for the existence of certain appointed boards to participate and assist with the regulation and operation of certain areas within the purview of the municipal government of the City of Jasper, Alabama; and

WHEREAS, certain of the appointed boards have for various reasons become obsolete and/or dormant, and are no longer needed for the effective and efficient government of the City of Jasper; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Jasper, Alabama, desires to formally eliminate such dormant and/or obsolete appointed boards, to increase the efficiency of government operations and to best suit the health and welfare of the citizens of the City of Jasper;

BE IT THEREFORE ORDAINED, as follows:

Section 1. Elimination of Park and Recreation Board.

a) Sections 15-1 and 15-3 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Jasper, Alabama, are hereby deleted, and the ordinances enacting such sections are repealed, such that there shall no longer be an appointed Park and Recreation Board within the City of Jasper, Alabama.

b). Any duties or responsibilities ascribed to the Park and Recreation Board by other sections of the said Code of Ordinances shall hereafter be discharged by the City of Jasper, Alabama, acting by its duly elected City Council and through its Chief Executive Officer, the Mayor of the City of Jasper, Alabama.

Section 2. Elimination of Tree Commission.

Chapter 20.5, consisting of Sections 20.5-1 through 20.5-8, inclusive, of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Jasper, Alabama, is hereby deleted, and the ordinance enacting such sections, Ordinance 1986-42, is hereby repealed, such that there shall no longer be an appointed Tree Commission within the City of Jasper, Alabama.

Section 3. Elimination of Architectural Review Board.

Article XV of Chapter 5, consisting of Sections 5-300 through 5-308, inclusive, of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Jasper, Alabama, is hereby deleted, and the ordinances enacting such sections, Ordinance 2004-08, is repealed, such that there shall no longer be an appointed Historical Preservation Commission or Architectural Review Board within the City of Jasper, Alabama.

Section 4. Standards and Criteria.

If any part, section or subdivision of this ordinance shall be held unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, such holding shall not be construed to invalidate or impair the remainder of this Ordinance, which shall continue in full force and effect notwithstanding such holding.

Section 5. Effective Date.






